Waitlist may apply.

Eligibility: Serves both male and female ex-offenders.

To Apply: Call for general information. A letter of inquiry is necessary to start the application process.

Fee: Room and board: \$400 per month, plus \$55 one-time, non-refundable administrative fee. Other services are free.

Description: Multi-systemic approach on a humanistic level for both male and female sex offenders and their partners/relatives. Focus on sexual compulsivity/addiction, compulsive disorders (kleptomania), sexual dysfunction/ enhancement, phobias, and compulsive theft. Offer court evaluations for sexual offenders and compulsive theft and plethysmograph assessments are available. Sexual deviancy evaluations are also offered.

Days/Hours: Noon–10PM, M-Th. Remaining hours by appointment only.

Eligibility: Admitted sexual offenders and those who struggle with sexual boundaries or appropriate sexual behavior, their partners, and/or relatives; persons involved in compulsive theft (Kleptomania). Individuals can self refer.

Description: Trainees begin the program making minimum wage. Trainees are eligible for a comprehensive benefits package including medical, dental, and vision after 3 months of employment. Regular employment opportunities are posted for trainees to apply for as they become available; no permanent positions are promised as part of the Basic Training Program. Job Line lists open positions in Pioneer Industries.

Days/Hours: 8AM–4:45PM, M-F.

Bus Routes: King County Metro routes 132 and 23.

Eligibility: Trainees must pass pre-assessment testing at 6th-grade math level and 8th-grade reading level, have an employment ID, and be able to work any shift. Requires pre-employment drug screening.
To Apply: Call Human Resources to be put on the list of participants for the next pre-assessment day. Trainees are accepted on a first come, first serve basis and will be notified of employment on assessment day.

Description: Provides state contracted work release/residential treatment program for offenders who have 6 months or less remaining on their sentences. Each resident must be working and be participating in appropriate treatment programs such as substance abuse treatment, parenting classes, life skills, and anger or stress management. Residents finish their sentences at the facility; they may leave only for work, school, or sponsored outings.

Days/Hours: Residential services provided 24 hours daily.

Bus Routes: Multiple King County Metro routes to downtown.

Eligibility: Men currently incarcerated in a state correctional institution.

To Apply: Screening review is based on referral by institutional counselor.

Fee: Residents pay \$13.50 per day for room and board; the State pays additional costs. Call for further information.

Description: Six month Christian-based program offers a residential social rehabilitation program, including individual and group counseling, spiritual counseling, and occupational therapy. Provides education about alcoholism and other drug addiction. Teaches communication and coping skills. Recreation program includes billiards, bowling, an exercise room, and a canteen. Clients can stay 6-12 months.

Days/Hours: Intake 7:30 AM – 1:00 PM M-F

Bus Routes: Over thirty King County Metro routes, including 31,107-110,174-177.

Eligibility: Adults 21 and over with identifiable social handicaps, including ex-offenders. Clients must be able to pass an alcohol and drug screening test at admission. Will not accept those who are under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs, or suffering from severe medical or psychiatric problems.

To Apply: Call or walk in to program office and complete a pre-screening packet. Referrals from court or probation department and other social service agencies are accepted.

Fees: No charge.

Description: Central planning and fund allocating body for publicly funded mental health and substance abuse treatment services in King County. The division is responsible for assessing the mental health and substance abuse treatment needs of King County residents and designing programs, relevant to age, to meet those needs. It allocates funds to provider agencies and sets policy guidelines for contractors. The division is also responsible for monitoring quality, consumer satisfaction, and outcomes of care.

Major components of the division include: 1) Crisis and Commitment Services - provides all initial mental health crisis outreach services, processes referrals, and conducts investigations under the Mental Health Involuntary Treatment Act; 2) Chemical Dependency Involuntary Treatment Services - processes referrals and conducts investigations under the Washington State Alcoholism, Intoxication, and Drug

Addiction Act to determine necessity for involuntary substance abuse treatment. 3) King County Assessment Center - screens and assesses individuals for benefit eligibility under the State of Washington ADATSA (Alcohol, Drug Abuse Treatment, & Support Act) legislation, and assists clients to obtain treatment for substance abuse problems and support while in recovery. 4) Dutch Shisler Sobering Support Center, open 24/7 to service chronic public inebriates and others in need of a safe and secure place to recover from the acute effects of intoxication.

Two volunteer citizen boards provide assistance and counsel to the division and county government. The Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Administrative Board and the Mental Health Advisory Board - both of which act as advocates to state and county governments to ensure access to services, quality of care, and client satisfaction.

Hours/Days:

Eligibility: Persons are individually assessed for eligibility for services through the mental health and/or substance abuse treatment system. Services are provided by community agencies under contract.

To Apply: For mental health services, call (800) 790-8049 to request a referral to a community mental health provider. In most cases, the mental health center will offer an appointment to come in and meet with an intake specialist or case manager to assess eligibility and medical need for care. This meeting is CONFIDENTIAL. Those who qualify for services will receive an individualized treatment plan as part of the assessment. The King County Assessment Center provides assessment, screening, referral, and case monitoring services for chemically dependent persons who have applied for assistance from the State of Washington through the Alcohol and Drug Addiction Treatment and Support Act (ADATSA).

Assessment counselors are out-stationed at all DSHS Community Services Office (CSO) sites in King County and at ten other sites, including jails. Contact (206) 296-7604 (voice) or (206) 296-7603 TDD.
